LA VISTA CITY COUNCIL MEETING August 20, 2013

A meeting of the City Council of the City of La Vista, Nebraska was convened in open and public session at 7:00 p.m. on August 20, 2013. Present were Councilmembers: Gowan, Ronan, Sheehan, Thomas, Crawford, Quick, Hale and Sell. Also in attendance were City Administrator Gunn, City Attorney McKeon, Assistant City Administrator Ramirez, City Clerk Buethe, Community Development Director Birch, Finance Director Lindberg, Fire Chief Uhl, Police Chief Lausten, Public Works Director Soucie, Public Building and Grounds Director Archibald, Recreation Director Stopak, Library Director Barcal, and City Engineer Kottmann.

A notice of the meeting was given in advance thereof by publication in the Times on August 7, 2013. Notice was simultaneously given to the Mayor and all members of the City Council and a copy of the acknowledgment of the receipt of notice attached to the minutes. Availability of the agenda was communicated to the Mayor and City Council in the advance notice of the meeting. All proceedings shown were taken while the convened meeting was open to the attendance of the public. Further, all subjects included in said proceedings were contained in the agenda for said meeting which is kept continuously current and available for public inspection at City Hall during normal business hours.

Mayor Kindig called the meeting to order and led the audience in the pledge of allegiance.

Mayor Kindig announced that a copy of the Open Meetings Act was posted on the west wall of the Council Chambers and copies were also available in the lobby of City Hall.

Mayor Kindig made an announcement regarding the agenda policy statement providing for an expanded opportunity for public comment on the agenda items.

REPORTS FROM CITY ADMINISTRATOR AND DEPARTMENT HEADS

City Administrator Gunn reminded Council and Staff that the Strategic Planning Workshop would begin Saturday at 8:00 a.m.

Fire Chief Uhl thanked the Mayor and Council for allowing him to attend the National Fire conference in Chicago.

Public Works Director Soucie stated that the tire collection would be held on August 24 from 8:00 a.m. to 2 p.m. Soucie informed Council that the Lillian and James intersection is completed and the Quiet Zone is set to begin September 9. There will be an open house on the Thompson Creek Project on September 17 from 5 p.m. to 7 p.m.

Community Development Director Birch stated that the Board of Appeals met on August 7 and dismissed the two cases. The house in question was purchased by Habitat for Humanity and a house will be built on the existing foundation. The Shadow Ridge Apartments are complying with the items found to be deficient during inspection. Mayor Kindig asked that the Habitat for Humanity property be checked with regard to mowing.

Library Director Barcal stated that there were 4,233 participants in the summer reading program which is an increase of 1,174 from last year. There were 623 registered for the reading program, which is up by 190 participants. In all, 6,100 hours were logged reading for the summer of 2013 and 49 schools were represented.

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B. FISCAL YEAR 13/14 MUNICIPAL BUDGET

1. APPROPRIATIONS ORDINANCE – SECOND READING

City Clerk Buethe read Ordinance No. 1197 entitled: AN ORDINANCE TO APPROPRIATE THE SUMS OF MONEY DEEMED NECESSARY TO DEFRAY ALL OF THE NECESSARY EXPENSES AND LIABILITIES OF THE CITY OF LA VISTA, SARPY COUNTY, NEBRASKA FOR THE FISCAL PERIOD BEGINNING ON OCTOBER 1, 2013 AND ENDING ON SEPTEMBER 30, 2014; SPECIFYING THE OBJECTS AND PURPOSES FOR WHICH SUCH APPROPRIATIONS ARE MADE AND THE AMOUNT TO BE APPROPRIATED FOR EACH OBJECT OR PURPOSE; SPECIFYING THE AMOUNT TO BE RAISED BY TAX LEVY; PROVIDING FOR THE CERTIFICATION OF THE TAX LEVY HEREIN SENT TO THE COUNTY CLERK OF SARPY COUNTY; AND PRESCRIBING THE TIME WHEN THIS ORDINANCE SHALL BE IN FULL FORCE AND EFFECT.

Councilmember Sell made a motion to approve Ordinance No. 1197 on its second reading and pass it on for final reading. Seconded by Councilmember Gowan. Tom Lamcyzh, Debra Arnold, and Ron Arnold addressed the Council regarding concerns of the impact of eliminating the funding for the MAT bus service through La Vista. Discussion was held regarding this and it was determined that City staff will try to set up a meeting with the three cities involved in the route and MAT and bring information back to Council at the next meeting. Mayor Kindig stated that in previous meetings MAT had stated they are not changing their charges. Councilmembers voting aye: Gowan, Ronan, Sheehan, Thomas, Crawford, Quick, Hale, and Sell. 2. MASTER FEE ORDINANCE – SECOND READING

City Clerk Buethe read Ordinance No. 1198 entitled: AN ORDINANCE TO AMEND ORDINANCE NO. 1185, AN ORDINANCE TO ESTABLISH THE AMOUNT OF CERTAIN FEES AND TAXES CHARGED BY THE CITY OF LA VISTA FOR VARIOUS SERVICES INCLUDING BUT NOT LIMITED TO BUILDING AND USE, ZONING, OCCUPATION, PUBLIC RECORDS, ALARMS, EMERGENCY SERVICES, RECREATION, LIBRARY, AND PET LICENSING; SEWER AND DRAINAGE SYSTEMS AND FACILITIES OF THE CITY FOR RESIDENTIAL USERS AND COMMERCIAL USERS (INCLUDING INDUSTRIAL USERS) OF THE CITY OF LA VISTA AND TO GRANDFATHER EXISTING STRUCTURES AND TO PROVIDE FOR TRACT PRECONNECTION PAYMENTS AND CREDITS; REGULATING THE MUNICIPAL SEWER DEPARTMENT AND RATES OF SEWER SERVICE CHARGES; TO PROVIDE FOR SEVERABILITY; AND TO PROVIDE THE EFFECTIVE DATE HEREOF.

Councilmember Quick made a motion to approve Ordinance No. 1198 on its second reading and pass it on for final reading. Seconded by Councilmember Crawford. Councilmembers voting aye: Gowan, Ronan, Sheehan, Thomas, Crawford, Quick, Hale, and Sell. Nays: None. Abstain: None. Absent: None. Motion carried.

C. ORDINANCE – AMEND CHAPTER 34 OF MUNICIPAL CODE - ADD SECTION 34.12 - INTERLOCAL COOPERATION

Councilmember Gowan introduced Ordinance No. 1199 entitled: AN ORDINANCE TO AMEND CHAPTER 34 OF THE LA VISTA MUNICIPAL CODE REGARDING FIRE DEPARTMENT TO ADD NEW SECTION 34.12; TO REPEAL CONFLICTING ORDINANCES PREVIOUSLY ENACTED; TO PROVIDE FOR SEVERABILITY; AND TO PROVIDE FOR THE EFFECTIVE DATE HEREOF.

Councilmember Sell moved that the statutory rule requiring reading on three different days be suspended. Councilmember Thomas seconded the motion to suspend the rules and roll call vote on the motion. The following Councilmembers voted aye: Gowan, Ronan, Sheehan, Thomas, Crawford, Quick, Hale, and Sell. The following voted nay: None. The following were absent: None. The motion to suspend the rules was adopted and the statutory rule was declared suspended for consideration of said ordinance.

Said ordinance was then read by title and thereafter Councilmember Sheehan moved for final passage of the ordinance which motion was seconded by Councilmember Gowan. The Mayor then stated the question, "Shall Ordinance No. 11949 be passed and adopted?" Upon roll call vote the following Councilmember voted aye: Gowan,

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Ronan, Sheehan, Thomas, Crawford, Quick, Hale, and Sell. The following voted nay: None. The following were absent: None. The passage and adoption of said ordinance having been concurred on by a majority of all members of the Council, the Mayor declared the ordinance adopted and the Mayor, in the presence of the Council, signed and approved the ordinance and the City Clerk attested the passage/approval of the same and affixed her signature thereto.

D. RESOLUTION – PURCHASE AND INSTALLATION OF A FIRE ALARM SYSTEM

Councilmember Crawford introduced and moved for the adoption of Resolution No. 13-079; A RESOLUTION OF THE MAYOR AND CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF LA VISTA, NEBRASKA APPROVING THE PURCHASE AND INSTALLATION OF A FIRE ALARM EVACUATION SYSTEM IN THE DISTRICT 1 FIRE STATION FROM GENERAL FIRE & SAFETY EQUIPMENT CO., OMAHA, NEBRASKA IN AN AMOUNT NOT TO EXCEED \$10,595.00.

WHEREAS, the City Council of the City of La Vista has determined that the purchase and installation of a fire alarm evacuation system in the District 1 Fire Station is necessary, and

WHEREAS, General Fire & Safety Equipment Company, Omaha, Nebraska is the lowest bidder for the purchase and installation of such system, and

WHEREAS, Subsection (c) of Section 31.23 of the La Vista Municipal Code requires that the City Administrator secure Council approval prior to authorizing any purchase over \$5,000.00.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Mayor and City Council of La Vista, Nebraska, do hereby approve the purchase and installation of a fire alarm evacuation system in the District 1 Fire Station from General Fire & Safety Equipment Company, Omaha, Nebraska, in an amount not to exceed \$10,595.00.

Seconded by Councilmember Gowan. Councilmembers voting aye: Gowan, Ronan, Sheehan, Thomas, Crawford, Quick, Hale and Sell. Nays: None. Abstain: None. Absent: None. Motion carried.

E. RESOLUTION - AUTHORIZE PURCHASE – DIGITAL RADIOS

Councilmember Quick introduced and moved for the adoption of Resolution No. 13-080: A RESOLUTION OF THE MAYOR AND CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF LA VISTA, NEBRASKA, ACCEPTING THE PROPOSAL SUBMITTED BY D & D COMMUNICATIONS, OMAHA, NE FOR PURCHASE OF NINE (9) PORTABLE MOTOROLA 800 MHZ P25 DIGITAL RADIOS IN AN AMOUNT NOT TO EXCEED \$19,604.00.

WHEREAS, the City Council of the City of La Vista has determined that purchasing the portable Motorola 800 MHz P25 digital radios is necessary; and

WHEREAS, said purchase of the portable Motorola 800 MHz P25 digital radios is in the best interest of the citizens of La Vista.

WHEREAS, the FY 12/13 budget contains funding for this project; and

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Mayor and City Council of La Vista, Nebraska, accept the proposal submitted by D & D Communications Omaha, NE for purchase of nine (9) portable Motorola 800 MHz P25 digital radios in an amount not to exceed \$19,604.00.

Seconded by Councilmember Thomas. Councilmembers voting aye: Gowan, Ronan, Sheehan, Thomas, Crawford, Quick, Hale and Sell. Nays: None. Abstain: None. Absent: None. Motion carried.

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F. RESOLUTION - APPROVAL - THOMPSON CREEK PHASE VI, PART 2 GRANT APPLICATION SUBMITTAL

Councilmember Quick introduced and moved for the adoption of Resolution No. 13-081; A RESOLUTION OF THE MAYOR AND CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF LA VISTA, NEBRASKA AUTHORIZING THE SUBMITTAL OF A GRANT APPLICATION TO THE NEBRASKA DEPARTMENT OF ENVIRONMENTAL QUALITY (NDEQ) AND THE NEBRASKA ENVIRONMENTAL TRUST (NET) AND THE APPLICATION REQUESTING FUNDS FROM THE PAPIO-MISSOURI RIVER NRD FOR PHASE VI, PART 2, YEAR 2 OF THE THOMPSON CREEK PROJECT IN LA VISTA NEBRASKA.

WHEREAS, the City Council of the City of La Vista has determined that said Thompson Creek improvements are necessary; and

WHEREAS, the requested FY 13/14 Capital Improvement Program budget contains funding for preparation of grant applications; and

WHEREAS, submittal of a grant application to the Nebraska Department of Environmental Quality (NDEQ) and the Nebraska Environmental Trust Fund is necessary; and

WHEREAS, submittal of an application requesting funds from the Papio-Missouri River NRD is necessary; and

WHEREAS, the City's consulting firms on this project, RDG, TD2, and AES have completed the grant applications for the Nebraska Environmental Trust Fund and the NDEQ grant and will prepare the application for the Papio-Missouri River NRD request for funds; and

WHEREAS, the City will authorize submittal of three applications for funding, based on the City Council's understanding of the fiscal commitments involved in the applications and a general outline of the scope of work that will be involved if the grants are approved;

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, by the Mayor and City Council of La Vista, Nebraska, authorizing the City Administrator to sign the grant applications to the Nebraska Department of Environmental Quality (NDEQ) and the Nebraska Environmental Trust Fund and the application requesting funds from the Papio-Missouri River NRD for Phase VI, Part 2, Year 2 of the Thompson Creek Project in La Vista, Nebraska.

Seconded by Councilmember Crawford. Councilmember Sheehan asked what the total cost will be to the City. City Engineer Kottmann stated it would be \$536,660.80. Councilmembers voting aye: Gowan, Ronan, Sheehan, Thomas, Crawford, Quick, Hale and Sell. Nays: None. Abstain: None. Absent: None. Motion carried.

Councilmember Sell introduced and moved for the adoption of Resolution No. 13-082; A RESOLUTION OF THE MAYOR AND CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF LA VISTA, NEBRASKA AUTHORIZING THE SALE AND CONSUMPTION OF BEER AT A BEER GARDEN AT LUCKY BUCKET BREWING COMPANY 11941 CENTENNIAL ROAD ON SEPTEMBER 13, 2013

WHEREAS, Lucky Bucket Brewing Company, 11941 Centennial Road is located within the City of La Vista; and

WHEREAS, Lucky Bucket Brewing Company has requested approval of a Special Designated Permit to sell and serve beer at a beer garden on the property on September 13, 2013 from 5:00 p.m. to 12:00 a.m.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Mayor and City Council of La Vista, Nebraska, do hereby authorize Lucky Bucket Brewing Company to proceed with the application for a "Special Designated License" from the Nebraska Liquor Control Commission to sell and serve beer at a beer garden on the property of Lucky Bucket Brewing Company, 11941 Centennial Road on September 13, 2013.

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Seconded by Councilmember Thomas. Councilmembers voting aye: Gowan, Ronan, Sheehan, Thomas, Crawford, Quick, Hale and Sell. Nays: None. Abstain: None. Absent: None. Motion carried.


