

City of La Vista
Park & Recreation Advisory Committee Minutes
March 16, 2022

A meeting of the Park and Recreation Advisory Committee for the City of LaVista convened in open and public session at 6:00 p.m. on Wednesday, March 16, 2022. Present was Recreation Director Scott Stopak, Asst. Recreation Director David Karlson, Senior Services Manager Kaily Stanley, Administrative Assistant Sue Tangeman, Public Works Parks Superintendent Jason Allen, Parks Crew Member Sydney Bower, Advisory Board Chairperson Pat Lodes, Members Jeff Kupfer, and Brenda Mechels-Stuby. Absent was Youth & Adult Sports Services Manager Denny Dinan and Member Bobette Jones.

A notice of the meeting was given in advance thereof by publication in the Papillion Times on March 9, 2021. Simultaneously given to the members of the Park and Recreation Advisory Committee and a copy of their acknowledgment of receipt of the notice are attached to the minutes. Availability of the agenda was communicated, in advance notice to the members of the Park and Recreation Advisory Committee of this meeting. All proceedings hereafter were taken while the convened meeting was open to attendance of the public. Further, all the subjects included in said proceedings were contained in the agenda for inspection within ten working days after said meeting, prior to the convened meeting of said body.

CALL TO ORDER

Director Scott Stopak called the meeting to order.

Stopak led the audience in the Pledge of Allegiance.

Stopak made an announcement of the location of the posted copy of the Open Meetings Act for public reference and read the Emergency Procedures Statement.

The next episode featured me and my new Fun Friday's Friend, Ashley Wemhoff. Ashley is the Teen Librarian at the La Vista Library. In this episode, I taught Ms. Ashley and our viewers how to make their own snow globes using mason jars and a few other simple supplies. This episode has had 351 views.

To round out the month, I was invited to be a guest reader with Ms. Jodi for Library Story Time. The book was titled "We Disagree". We used this book as a way to show children that it's OK to disagree with someone, and that there are ways to do it and still remain friends and be respectful to each other. The story time generated over 331 views in the first few days it aired.

Our next episode will be out this week, and I will be joined by another newcomer to Fun Friday with Friends, our very own Ms. Kaily. Ms. Kaily (Stanley) is the Senior Center Manager. This episode featured us showing our La Vista friends how to make "clothes-pin puppets". This was an incredibly cute craft that families can do together. We have a limited supply of Clothes-pin Puppet Grab & Go Kits available at the Community Center, so families can come on up a get one.

YOUTH AND ADULT SPORTS

Adult Women's Volleyball: Winter session has played 9 games of a 12-game schedule. The Winter season will end on March 30. The Spring session will start on April 6 and will play a shorter 6 game session.

Youth Basketball League: League finished on March 5. We had 77 players with 9 teams this year which is about the same as last year but way down from 148 players in 2020 pre-covid.

Basketball Skills Competition: This event was held for the first time on Sunday, Feb 27 and included an obstacle course, hot shot contest and free throw contest for boys and girls in 3rd grade through 8th grade. We had 26 participants which we felt was a good number for the first year of this event. The previous years' event was just a 3 point and free throw contest.

Spring Programs

Registration is currently winding down and deadlines are approaching for 2022 Spring and Summer Youth and Adult programs such as baseball, softball, t-ball, flag football and soccer.

Coaches are being assigned and teams are being formed as practices begin on April 4, with games starting in later April and May.

Field Usage

Playing fields will open for use starting April 4, weather permitting. It appears it will be a busy season with most of the fields being utilized throughout the season.

Also, we have a Disc Golf Tournament scheduled for Sunday, March 27 at the Central Park by the lake Nebraska Disc Golf opened a store at 72nd & Harrison St., and they approached use regarding this event. They are hoping for 90 participants and the event in La Vista is the first leg of several tournaments to be held at different locations in the area.

SENIOR SERVICES

PUBLIC WORKS PARKS DEPT.

Bower updated the Board on what the Parks Crew has been keeping busy with over the winter months and now that Spring is approaching.

Luke Wagner is now a full-time parks crew member at the Sports Complex. Luke was previously a part-time employee.

Parks Dept. purchased a new ride-on sprayer/spreader that will make it better for spraying fertilizer and weed control in the parks.

Completed list of tree removals and cleanup of Thompson Creek. Tennis Courts are open. Portable bathrooms are there for use since the permanent bathrooms have been removed during the Thompson Creek Construction.

Jason Allen, Parks Superintendent, also gave an update on the Thompson Creek re-alignment project. He said it should be done in May or June of this year.

B. 5-Year Tree Plan – Presentation by Jason Allen, Parks Superintendent

Allen presented the 5-year tree plan, stating that they are going to update this every year, in approximately February. Allen supplied a packet to the Board for their review. He summarized the contents, discussing the Commemorative Tree Program, Thompson Creek, citizen reports on damage, etc. Also getting the information out to the citizens through videos on website.

Member Kupfer asked what the Tree City certification means. Allen said it tells our citizens that we are doing the best we can to maintain our urban forest. We have to apply for it and report hours of pruning, maintenance, planting, expenses, etc. We have been a Tree City for over 30 years.

We will be getting our own Tree plotter software in the near future, but we have been utilizing a free trial for the software. It shows in the packet provided what can be done with it.

The Board is being asked for a recommendation of approval to present to City Council for approval. Chairperson Lodes made a motion for approval. Seconded by Member Mechels-Struby. All ayes. Motion carried.

C. Jaycee Park Playground Proposal – Presentation by Jason Allen, Park Superintendent

Allen said he is going to apply for an NRD grant to match funds for park improvements. Jaycee Park has equipment over 40 years old, so we thought that was a good park to continue the mini-park plan that was started with Eberle-Walden Park in 2020. The packet given to the Board shows plans for the park. The 2nd plan was decided upon from the Park Committee, and now needs approval from the Board to move forward.

Allen said he would like to go back over the mini-park plans, and possibly streamline the plans to make them more feasible and cost-effective to be able to move forward.
