YOUTH AND ADULT SPORTS

December totals: Adults = 101; Children = 144; Total=245; Avg = 31

Januarys: Adults = 133; Children = 168; Total = 301; Avg = 30

Adult Women's Fall Volleyball:

The 2023 Winter league has all 8 teams returning and began on January 4, and will play a 12-game schedule.

Youth Basketball League games started on January 21 and will be played at the La Vista Community Center on Saturday's from 10am – 5:30pm. We have 66 participants this year compared to 77 last year.

The number of teams this year:

3rd/4th grade boys = 2, girls = 1

5th/6th grade boys = 2, girls = 1

7th/8th grade boys = 2

Youth Basketball Clinic for 1st/2nd grades started on January 14 and will run for 5 weeks. We have 31 participants this year compared to 35 last year.

Basketball Skills Competition is taking on a March Madness theme and will be held on Tuesday, March 7. Competition will have separate divisions for 3rd -8th grade boys and girls. Competition will include a timed skills obstacle course, hot shot contest and a free throw contest.
