
Lastly, the City is recruiting volunteers for its spring and summer events. You can register at CityofLaVista.org/Volunteer.

Highlights of recent City Council action.

- Approved a new contract with the La Vista Fraternal Order of Police.
- Authorized purchase and installation of new flooring in the Community Center's meeting rooms.

POLICE

The Police Department did its part to ensure the City's distinctive experiences were safe. When new concerts and events came to The Astro Amphitheater and City Centre, LVPD responded proactively to evolving public safety needs for parking and crowd management. LVPD even hosted a few key experiences of its own, including its annual Youth Police Academy and National Night Out.

LIBRARY

The Library welcomed 2,014 more visitors in 2023 than in 2022 and offered programming nearly every day it was open. Storytimes for children, game nights for teens and book clubs for adults were just a few of the experiences the Library regularly provided last year.

ENHANCEMENTS

The Public Works Department delivered enhancements across La Vista that improved the community's quality of life. The Applewood Creek Trail and Underpass project was completed, resulting in a more connected trail system for residents. New playground equipment was installed in Jaycee Park, along with basketball hoops in Central Park East. Public Works also completed two extensive street improvement projects in 2023.



EXPLORING NEW OPPORTUNITIES

Beyond assisting with construction oversight activities for Central Park and City Centre projects, the Community Development team completed planning and zoning review processes for new developments such as the Residence Inn and Holiday Inn Express hotels and Panda Express in the Southport area, Tommy's Car Wash, and Sagebrook Apartments.

In 2023, the City also advanced projects that will drive new progress in La Vista, including work on various processes that will allow for the Phase 1 construction of the Corridor 84 Streetscape Plan and securing grant funding for the City's Bicycle and Pedestrian Plan.

RETIREMENTS

ADMINISTRATIVE ASSISTANT **MARCIA GUSTAFSON**

Administrative Assistant Marcia Gustafson is retiring after nearly 10 years of service at City Hall. Gustafson came to the City as an accounting temporary worker and was soon added to the full-time staff.

Marcia has kept an eagle eye on the City's accounts payables and receivables as well as payroll and she says one

of her proudest accomplishments was discovering the City had been overpaying on a copier lease and then working to get a refund from the vendor.



POLICE CHIEF **BOB LAUSTEN**

Police Chief Bob Lausten is retiring after 33 years of service to the City. He came to work in La Vista after working as a police officer in the Los Angeles area and worked as a patrol and crime prevention officer before being promoted to Lieutenant and eventually to Chief in 2002.

Lausten was responsible for bringing Santa's Sleigh Ride to La Vista, a tradition he first saw in California. He says one highlight he'll also remember was in 1992 when the Police Department created "Safety City", which was a kindergarten and first grade safety program with little houses he built.



CODE ENFORCEMENT OFFICER **COLIN "LUCKY" RUPPERT**

Code Enforcement Officer Colin "Lucky" Ruppert is retiring after 14 years of service in the Police Department. Lucky served the community in both property and evidence as well as the Code Enforcement Officer.

Lucky is perhaps as well known for his role as Santa Claus at many Christmas events over the years, which he says was one of the highlights of his time working in La Vista. Lucky and his wife, Debbie, are planning a few little trips, and he says he's hoping to finally get his garage in order.



CHIEF BUILDING OFFICIAL **JEFF SINNETT**

Chief Building Official Jeff Sinnett is retiring with 26 years of service to the community. Sinnett came to the City of La Vista from the City of Plattsburgh and served as La Vista's building inspector as well as planning and zoning administrator until his promotion to Chief Building Official in 2002.

Sinnett says he's proud of the fact that the City was able to finally clean up

the corner of 72nd and Harrison, and more recently he has been integrally involved in the ongoing development of Southport on La Vista's western edge as well as the City's redevelopment efforts along 84th Street.

Sinnett and his wife, Debbie, are planning to travel a bit in retirement, including to see New England in the fall, some national parks as well as visit their children and grandchildren around the country.

La Vista police officers recognized for lifesaving actions.

Officers Seth Howard and Tommy Robb were recently presented the La Vista Police Department's Lifesaving Award at a City Council meeting. The officers received the award for actions they took to save the life of an individual suffering from a drug overdose.

The officers responded to a rescue call one evening while on duty, and they arrived to find a 22-year-old woman who was in medical distress and struggling to breathe. After determining she was likely experiencing a drug overdose, the pair worked rapidly to administer medication that stabilized her.

If the officers had not responded quickly and taken the actions they did, the woman most likely would not have survived.

Officers Howard and Robb are both relatively new to the La Vista Police Department. These officers and their lifesaving actions are very appreciated.

MARCH MADNESS

Bringing excitement & friendly competition to the Community Center.

Cinderella stories, buzzer beaters and come-from-behind wins thrill basketball fans each March—and not just during the NCAA tournament. La Vista has its own piece of the action.

La Vista's Recreation Department and Sarpy County Tourism co-host a March Madness basketball skills competition annually for third through eighth graders. During the contest, boys and girls compete in three challenges: Hot Shot, an obstacle course and a free throw contest.

This year, La Vista's March Madness will span two days, with younger age groups competing on Monday, March 4 and older groups on Tuesday, March 5. Awards will be given to the winners of each challenge, and an overall champion will be named in each age division.

Denny Dinan, La Vista Recreation's Youth and Adult Sports Manager, explained that the new two-day format will help shorten contest wait times at the popular event.

"Last year's competition was our biggest yet," said Dinan. "More than 50 participants and their parents filled the gym," Dinan said. **"We'd love to see even more young people join us this March."**

Event organizers introduced "money balls" to the competition last year, and they have some additional surprises planned this year.



Alex Schiphoff, Sarpy County Tourism's Athletic Events Coordinator explained that this year's event will include some fun new updates to the three challenges. Schiphoff also stressed that March Madness is unique because it is welcoming to all participants across various age groups and skill levels.

"The atmosphere is extremely positive, and the competitors are really supportive of each other," said Schiphoff. "Anyone can participate and have fun." Dinan added that "It was incredible to see the sportsmanship last year as the boys and girls cheered for and encouraged one another."



Street resurfacing project slated to start this spring.

Streets in La Vista's Briarwood neighborhood (west of Edgewood Blvd. between La Vista Middle School and Central Park) will soon be resurfaced using a street maintenance method called the Ultra-Thin Bonded Asphalt System or UBAS.

The project, which is scheduled to begin this spring and run into early summer, will involve grinding the top layer of concrete off the neighborhood's streets and installing an asphalt layer over the remaining concrete.

By using the UBAS resurfacing method, the City is able to proactively maintain streets in La Vista that are in good condition and save money.

The cost to complete a UBAS resurfacing project is typically a fraction of the cost of traditional mill and overlay resurfacing.

The City completed a UBAS project in the Giles Corner neighborhood in 2022, and finished a UBAS project in Crestview Heights in 2023.

The asphalt overlay project for Edgewood, Greenleaf and Valley is currently out to bid and the City hopes to have a contractor on board by the end of February. Residents will receive letters to notify them of work schedules and street restrictions.


Central Park road reconstruction update.

Road improvements will continue in Central Park East this spring.

Work will begin soon on the section of road that connects from Edgewood Blvd. through the park to the new Park View Blvd. access road.

In the coming months, construction crews will work to remove the asphalt on the road and replace it with concrete, parking stalls and the tennis court parking lot. This project will also provide pedestrian and utility connections to the bathroom and shelter amenities that will be installed later this year.

The road reconstruction project could be completed by late spring, weather dependent.
