LA VISTA CITY COUNCIL MEETING March 7, 2017

A meeting of the City Council of the City of La Vista, Nebraska was convened in open and public session at 7:00 p.m. on March 7, 2017. Present were Councilmembers: Ronan, Sheehan, Thomas, Crawford, Quick, Hale and Sell. Also in attendance were City Attorney McKeon, City Administrator Gunn, Assistant City Administrator Ramirez, City Clerk Buethe, Police Chief Lausten, Director of Administrative Services Pokorny, Community Development Director Birch, Director of Public Works Soucie, City Engineer Kottmann, Library Director Barcal, and Human Resource Manager Garrod.

A notice of the meeting was given in advance thereof by publication in the Times on February 22, 2017. Notice was simultaneously given to the Mayor and all members of the City Council and a copy of the acknowledgment of the receipt of notice attached to the minutes. Availability of the agenda was communicated to the Mayor and City Council in the advance notice of the meeting. Upon roll call vote the following Councilmembers voted aye Ronan, Sheehan, Thomas, Crawford, Quick, Hale and Sell. Nays: None. Abstain: None. Absent: Frederick. The passage and adoption of said ordinance having been concurred on by a majority of all members of the Council, the Mayor declared the ordinance adopted and the Mayor, in the presence of the Council, signed and approved the ordinance and the City Clerk attested the passage/approval of the same and affixed her signature thereto.

G. DISCUSSION - SCHOOL RESOURCE OFFICER

Police Chief Lausten and Papillion La Vista Schools Superintendent, Dr. Rikly, brought forth information addressing the need for a Resource Officer to be placed at the Jr. High School. Councilmembers Sell stated an officer could be a positive influence on kids. Councilmember Crawford asked if having an officer in school would help cut down on bullying. Police Chief Lausten confirmed that it can help and is a step in the right direction, but it would not stop all bullying. Building relationships with students can give a tactical advantage to ward off negative behaviors prior to things getting out of hand. Councilmember Sheehan mentioned we have seen this advantage in regards to the DARE officer as they often build positive relationships with students and are treated as a best friend by many. Mayor Kindig and the Council supported Chief Lausten and staff to begin working on an interlocal agreement to share the cost of the officer with the school district. This would be a three-year agreement, with a target start date of March 2018. Dr. Rikly thanked the Council for this important step.

PLANNING COMMISSION MINUTES
FEBRUARY 16TH, 2017-7:00 P.M.

The City of La Vista Planning Commission held a meeting on Thursday, February 16th, in the Harold "Andy" Anderson Council Chamber at La Vista City Hall, 8116 Park View Boulevard. Chairman Gayle Malmquist called the meeting to order at 7:00 p.m. with the following members present: Mike Krzywicki, Gayle Malmquist, John Gahan, Kevin Wetuski, Harold Sargus, Kathleen Alexander, Jason Dale and Jackie Hill. Members absent were: Tom Miller and Mike Circo. Also in attendance were Chris Solberg, City Planner; Meghan Engberg, Permit Technician, John Kottmann, City Engineer; and Rocky Henkel, Streets Superintendent.

Legal notice of the public meeting and hearing were posted, distributed and published according to Nebraska law. Notice was simultaneously given to all members of the Planning Commission. All proceedings shown were taken while the convened meeting was open to the attendance of the public.

1. Call to Order

The meeting was called to order by Chairman Malmquist at 7:00 p.m. Copies of the agenda and staff reports were made available to the public.

2. Approval of Meeting Minutes – January 19, 2017

Krzywicki moved, seconded by *Alexander* to approve the January 19th minutes with corrections.
Ayes: Sargus, Krzywicki, Malmquist, Wetuski, Alexander, Hill, Gahan, and Dale. Nays: None.
Abstain: None. Absent: Miller and Circo. Motion Carried. (8-0)

None.

4. New Business

A. Public Hearing for the review of the One & Six Year Road Plan

- i. **Staff Report – Rocky Henkel:** Henkel came up to give an update on the One and Six year road program to let everyone know what projects were completed last year and what projects have been identified to be completed this year. He mentioned that last year the resurfacing of 66th St. from Harrison to Giles was completed and Giles Rd. from 66th to 69th St. Also, Port Side Pkwy. was completed from 125th St. to Westport Pkwy. He then went on to talk about the projects that have been identified to be completed this year. Henkel went on to discuss the engineering and ROW acquisition project for intersection of 132nd St. and West Giles Rd. with the City's portion being \$15,000, as well as Sarpy County's, while Federal's is \$126,000.

They anticipate this project making the May bid letting, so hopefully everything is on track for that project. Henkel then showed some pictures depicting the area. He said that this project includes Engineering and Construction costs. Henkel then talked about the project on 84th St. from Harrison to Giles Rd, which is the adaptive signals project. He anticipates this project being bid in July, so everything is on pace for the project as well.

Sargus asked if the cost of the project was just for the signals or if it includes everything.

Henkel said that it includes everything; the studies, the software and the equipment. He then mentioned that John Kottmann could probably explain better and give more information, if they wanted it.

Malmquist asked what the "other" funding source listed was.

Henkel said that "other" was listed as the project is a collaborative effort from the cities of Ralston, Papillion, and Omaha.

He then went on to talk about the project at the intersection of 96th and Brentwood Dr.: installing traffic signals at that intersection, which should be going in sometime this fall. The next project he brought up is a concrete panel replacement on Harrison St. He is in the process of drawing up a contract for that project and it should be going out sometime this spring, with \$315,000 allocated for that project. The next project brought up was Giles Rd.; an asphalt overlay from Harrison St. to Interstate 80. This contract has been awarded with a start date in June. He then talked about the Giles Rd. Widening design and traffic study. Henkel then brought up the 84th St. Public Improvements Redevelopment Project and anticipates that \$1,000,000 will be spent in this project in the coming year. Right now it's in 30% design and they are hoping to have 60% by April. The last project he mentioned for this year was the Multi-Sports Complex, which has been allocated \$700,000 in engineering and design. Henkel then asked if there were any questions.

Hill brought up the '18 agenda for the Multi-Sport Complex and mentioned that they \$9.3 million listed and asked if he had any idea what the break out is on that.

Henkel said that it's for public infrastructure.

Hill asked what the city's contribution was for this project.

Kottmann said that \$9.3M is the construction cost and that is the public improvements and the parking improvements that the city would be providing and that there is no funding split.

ii. Public Hearing: Opened by Maimquist

Malmquist closed the public hearing as no members of the public came forward.

- iii. **Recommendation:** Krzywicki moved, seconded by Wetuski to recommend approval to the City Council of the One and Six Year Road Plan for 2017. **Ayes:** Sargus, Krzywicki, Malmquist, Wetuski, Alexander Hill, Gahan, and Dale. **Nays:** None. **Abstain:** None. **Absent:** Miller and Circo. **Motion Carried. (8-0)**

B. Public Hearing Zoning Map Amendment – Lot 1 Lakeview South II, Lot 1 Lakeview South II Replat 4, Lots 1 and 2 Lakeview South II Replat 6, Lot 2 Lakeview South II Replat 2, South 1551.37FT TAX LOT 4 23-14-11 – J & H Investments LLC

- i. **Staff Report – Chris Solberg:** Solberg states that the applicants, J & H Investments LLC, is requesting a rezoning of the aforementioned lots northwest of the intersection of Meadows Blvd. and 145th St, from C-3 and I-1 along with a Gateway Corridor Overlay to I-2 with Gateway Corridor Overlay over a portion of the property. Staff's recommendation is for the approval of the amendment to the Zoning Map from the aforementioned zoning, as depicted on the Zoning Map Amendment Exhibit, as the request is consistent with the Zoning Ordinance and the Comprehensive Plan.
- ii. **Applicant Presentation:** Douglas Dreessen came up and spoke on this agenda item, on behalf of the applicants. He said that he is there to answer any questions they may have. Dreessen then showed some slides of what they are proposing to do. He said that there are 4 lots and that they will have a variety of uses. He mentioned that there will be a pavement repair company, an industrial equipment company, a concrete recycler and that they all planning on continuing their operations at this location. He said that Woodhouse is also purchasing some of the property to the north and we will learn about that later in the meeting.
- iii. **Public Hearing – Malmquist opened the public hearing.**

Malmquist closed the public hearing as no members from the public came forward.
- iv. **Recommendation:** Gahan moved, seconded by Sargus to recommend approval to the City Council, item 4B of the Zoning Map Amendment as described earlier by the chair. **Ayes:** Sargus, Krzywicki, Malmquist, Wetuski, Alexander Hill, Gahan, and Dale. **Nays:** None. **Abstain:** None. **Absent:** Miller and Circo. **Motion Carried. (8-0)**

C. Preliminary Plat – Heimes – J & H Investments LLC

- i. **Staff Report – Chris Solberg:** Solberg states that the applicant, J & H Investments LLC is requesting approval of the Preliminary Plat to divide S 1551.37 FT of Tax Lot 4 (23-14-11) and Lot 2 Lakeview South II Replat 6 into multiple lots with associated right-of-way. Solberg mentioned that the location of the property is the Northwest intersection of Meadows Blvd. and 145th St. Staff recommends approval of the preliminary plat, contingent on the approval of the amendment to the Zoning Map (Rezoning) request listed on the agenda as item 4B and the finalization of storm water and traffic issues prior to City Council review, as the request is consistent with the Subdivision Regulations and the Comprehensive Plan.

Doug Dreessen came up to speak on this item. He showed a rendering of the improvements that are contemplated. He pointed out the cul de sac that he referred to before. He mentioned that there are four parcels to the back, west portion and the other parcels, along the frontage, will remain the same. He mentioned that the Woodhouse project will be on the north side. He said that they are in the process of working through the drainage and traffic issues on the project with Woodhouse and the NRD. He said that his understanding is that there aren't any real big issues there at this point and that they will get those contingencies taken care of. He then invited the commission to ask any questions they may have.

Malmquist asked what Heimes will be doing out there and if they are the owners or operators.

Dreessen said that they are the owners and operators. He said they currently have a location out by Sapp Bros. that includes concrete recycling, utility installs and those kinds of things. They will be expanding into that area some and are also selling off some of their property for Woodhouse's operation. They are also accommodating the Ditch Witch dealer that is out there currently, so it's kind of an expansion of what is already there. The paving contractor is fairly new to the area, but they're excited to be out in that area as well.

Hill mentioned that she noticed that the Papillion NRD has some concern about the drainage direction into the spillway and asked what the concerns were.

Dreessen said he wasn't sure what their concerns were. He said that the drainage has all been directed away from their property, so he believes that's been resolved with them.

Krzywicki mentioned that the Papio NRD in the last couple of years has been trying to minimize the amount of additional flow into the street, streams, and creeks, etc. He asked in a development like this, where they have put a lot of imperviable pavement, buildings and stuff on the property, which leaves less land to soak in the water, what type of regulations would a developer like this have to comply with.

Kottmann said that La Vista is a member of the Papillion Creek Watershed partnership and our interlocal agreement with the other agencies, which includes Papio NRD, is requiring us to implement their watershed management policies, essentially that is no increase in 2-year peak flows above existing conditions and

treatment of the first ½" of run off. He says those are stated in the chapter 154 of our Municipal Code, which are the basic criteria. He said that we also have a subdivision regulation requirement that 10-year peak flows cannot exceed 125% of predevelopment peak flows, so several criteria are in place and they have done drain studies, demonstrating those compliances and there are some details they have asked to look over in coordination with Woodhouse to the north. Kottman continued to state that they had a meeting with them last week and it looks like they are finishing up on that. They will eventually need to get Sarpy County to sign off because they control the culverts on Giles Rd., which is the reason for the stipulation.

Solberg said that he'd like to point out that there is an error on page 2 under the Staff Report.

- ii. **Recommendation – Preliminary Plat** *Krzywicki* moved, seconded by *Dale* to recommend approval to City Council the approval of the preliminary plat, contingent on the approval of the amendment to the Zoning Map (Rezoning) request listed on the agenda as item 4B and the finalization of storm water and traffic issues prior to City Council review, as the request is consistent with the Subdivision Regulations and the Comprehensive Plan. **Ayes:** *Sargus, Krzywicki, Maimquist, Wetuski, Alexander Hill, Gahan, and Dale*. **Nays:** *None*. **Abstain:** *None*. **Absent:** *Miller and Circo*. **Motion Carried. (8-0)**

D. Waiver, Revised Preliminary Plat, Final Plat, and Public Hearing on Planned Unit Development Site Plan and Conditional Use Permit – Woodhouse Place – LB Southwest Investments, LLC

- i. **Staff Report – Chris Solberg:** Solberg said that the applicant, LB Southwest Investments, LLC is requesting Number 1, a waiver of section 4.24 of the Subdivision Regulations regarding minimum centerline radius of a local street, from 200 feet to 150 feet. Number 2, a revised Preliminary Plat for Woodhouse Place. Number 3, a Final Plat for Woodhouse Place. Number 4, a Planned Unit Development site plan for Woodhouse Place and Number 5, a Conditional Use Permit for Woodhouse Place. Solberg said that this is for Tax Lot 4 EXC S 1551.37 FT & EXC ROW 23-14-11. Staff's recommendation is approval of the request for waiver of Section 4.24 of the Subdivision Regulations regarding minimum centerline radius of a local street from 200-150 feet. Staff also recommends approval of the revised preliminary plat, contingent on the approval of the waiver of Section 4.24 of the Subdivision Regulations and the resolution of traffic, sewerage, and drainage study issues prior to City Council review, as the request is consistent with the Subdivision Regulations and the Comprehensive Plan. Staff recommends approval of the final plat, contingent on the approval of the revised Preliminary Plat, as the request is consistent with the Subdivision Regulations and the Comprehensive Plan. Staff recommends approval of the PUD Site Plan, contingent on the approval of the revised Preliminary Plat and Final Plat, as the request is consistent with the Zoning Regulations and the Comprehensive Plan. Finally, staff recommends approval of the Conditional Use Permit, contingent on the approval of the revised Preliminary Plat,

Final Plat, And PUD Site Plan, as the request is consistent with the Zoning Regulations and the Comprehensive Plan.

- ii. **Applicant Presentation:** Larry Jobeun came up and spoke on behalf of the applicant. He mentioned that Mike McIntosh from Lamp Ryneerson and Paul Cech from Woodhouse were there with him as well. Jobeun then showed the commissioners a site plan. He said that this is a 30 acre site on the southwest corner of 144th and Giles. He said that the recommendations brought forth tonight will allow the construction of auto dealerships at this particular site. On the north will be a Hyundai dealership, the one immediately to the south is the Nissan dealership, and the one immediately south of that is the Mazda dealership and the final dealership is the Lincoln dealership. He asked them to note that there is a public street that connects to Giles Rd. that goes all the way through the site and connects to the south. He said that it will be built to public standards, but will be paid for privately. He said that have been working with the County and the City regarding the extensions and the sanitary outfall to the north to make the connection to provide sanitary sewer for not only that site, but potentially the sites to the south as well. Jobeun said that the drainage way will be preserved and the water from that drainage way will go under Giles Rd. and dissipate to the north. He then pointed out that the other detention basin is in the outlot on the corner of that lot. He said that there are really only 2 lots on that site plan, one consists of everything on the west side of 145th St. and the other lot is immediately on the west side between 144th and 145th St. Jobeun then said that as far as the PUD is concerned, they are hoping to have a general buildable area and within that buildable area they can pretty much build whatever they are applying for here. He then showed some conceptual elevations of the buildings. He said that the Hyundai will be a 2 story building and each floor will be 30,000 sq. ft. plus or minus 5,000 sq. ft. depending on what the dealership would actually like there. The Nissan dealership is also a 2 story building and the other 2 buildings will be 1 story buildings. As far as public improvements, there is a decel lane on the site off of Giles Rd. and of course they have the waiver request for the minimum centerline radius. He said that he appreciates the recommendation of the staff and that they are there to answer any questions.

Maimquist reminded everyone that the initial request is for the waiver of Section 4.24. She then asked what the rationale was for that.

Jebuen said that he would probably have Mike McIntosh come up and speak on the engineering aspect of it, but showed on the site plan that the waiver still meets the requirements to allow a truck to get in and out and make all the turns without impacting, by staying on the road.

Mike McIntosh came up and explained that the reason for the decrease in radius was that they had to modify the buildings due to the stream being in place. They had to tighten the radius up in order to fit the 4 buildings on the site. He said that there were some concerns on whether the truck movements could still make that turn and not cross over the center line on Giles Rd. and so they ran the auto turn engineering analysis, actually widened the turning radius a little bit so that trucks

could still turn and make that without crossing over the center line. He feels like they addressed the main concern of the 200 to 150.

Kottmann then said that in addition to the jurisdictional water way that Mike mentioned, they were also required to keep the access connection to Giles Rd. as far to the west as possible away from 144th St., so that pushed that connection point very far to the west and created a challenge in geometry to get to that western location.

Malmquist asked if the westerly way in was better.

Kottmann said they've made modifications to the pavement geometry that allowed for the reduced center line radius without any negative turning impacts on Giles Rd. He is satisfied that they have compensated for the radius change.

Gahan said that he had a question in regards to the draining of the storm water into the field to the north and asked if that was an acceptable way of letting the water just sit there potentially after some heavy rain, day after day after day.

Kottmann asked Gahan if he meant the north side of Giles or the detention basins on the site.

Gahan then asked if he misunderstood or does water go from retention from the property on Giles Rd. and go to that field.

McIntosh said that there are existing culverts there where is currently drains to that field and that they are using detention ponds to reduce the flow. He said that it will continue to go to those existing culverts and looked at the capacity to make sure they don't go over.

Krzywicki asked if they have a retention pond on their property.

McIntosh said that they actually have two. He then showed them where they were at.

Hill brought up the diagram that they were showing and the waiver. She clarified that the reason they were asking for the waiver was because of the turning radius off of Giles and if it was because of the Hyundai building that is there and if they don't have enough room.

McIntosh said yes. He said that when they originally analyzed the drainage swell that runs through the middle of the site, they didn't believe it was originally jurisdictional and they were able to move the buildings and curve them and allow more space. When they found out that the swell was jurisdictional, they had to realign the site and had to line the buildings all up and when they did that, they ran out of space to do a 200 foot radius and all 4 buildings on that same space. They needed to tighten up the radius.

Hill then asked if there was no option to make the buildings a little bit smaller.

Jobeun said that the automobile manufacturers are very particular about the size and look of their dealerships, so there really isn't that opportunity and in order to really have the site function properly and have these 4 buildings, you had to really use that space up and that's why they requested that waiver.

Hill then asked the applicant to verify that this wasn't a convenience accommodation.

Jobeun said no, but that the point is that the intersection functions properly and that he believes that Mr. Kottmann agrees with that. He said in order to prevent a hardship or in order for this project to move forward, they need the 4 car dealerships to make it feasible to put in the public improvements. He said as an accommodation to that, they worked with the City and determined that that waiver request was acceptable.

Krzywicki brought up a slide that showed how the trucks would make the turn out onto Giles, but asked about when the trucks come to deliver vehicles onto the property and how they would be turning into the parking areas or wherever they would be dropping off the cars that are on their trailers turn into that development.

Jobeun asked if he meant through the site when they are making deliveries.

Krzywicki said yes and then asked how they would be making deliveries if there is a lot of turning radius going into the lots from that access road that's through the property.

Jobeun said that he believed that the trucks would come in and serve the properties. He showed the internal drive lanes that go through the site and said from that public street you can drive all the way back and exit through that location.

Solberg asked if he wanted to know about the turning radiuses into those lanes.

Krzywicki said yes.

Paul Cech then came up to speak. He said that the new cars are actually dropped off on the Heimes property that was talked about earlier. They have ample room to get a semi up and around there and out of that property. He said their intention was to put it on the 5 acre property and not have tractor trailers running through that property.

Solberg said that it is also important to note that in the PUD plan set there is a truck access exhibit that shows the truck movements through the site.

- iii. Recommendation – Request for Waiver: Section 4.24 of the Subdivision Regulations** Sargus moved, seconded by Gahan to approve the request of the waiver for section 4.24 of the Subdivision Regulations regarding minimum centerline

radius of a local street from 200 feet to 150 feet as presented. **Ayes: Sargus, Krzywicki, Malmquist, Wetuski, Alexander, Gahan, and Dale. Nays: Hill. Abstain: None. Absent: Miller and Circo. Motion Carried. (7-1)**

- iv. **Recommendation – Revised Preliminary Plat** Gahan moved, seconded by Wetuski, that item E2, the Revised Preliminary Plat for Woodhouse Place be approved, as the request is consistent with the Subdivision Regulations and the Comprehensive Plan. **Ayes: Sargus, Krzywicki, Malmquist, Wetuski, Alexander, Gahan, and Dale. Nays: Hill. Abstain: None. Absent: Miller and Circo. Motion Carried. (7-1)**
- v. **Recommendation – Final Plat** Gahan moved, seconded by Sargus for recommendation of approval to the City Council item 4E for final plat for the Woodhouse Place as the request is consistent with the Subdivision Regulations and the Comprehensive Plan. **Ayes: Sargus, Krzywicki, Malmquist, Wetuski, Alexander, Gahan, and Dale. Nays: Hill. Abstain: None. Absent: Miller and Circo. Motion Carried. (7-1)**
- vi. **Public Hearing – Planned Unit Development Site Plan and Conditional Use Permit**

Malmquist opened the public hearing.

Larry Jobeun came up and spoke on this agenda item. He said that this applies to the Planned Unit Development and the site plan that they went over earlier and that the Conditional Use Permit would actually allow them to operate under the C-3 zoning classification. He said that he would happy to answer any questions and go through the site plan again.

Malmquist asked Jobeun to point out the truck access that was discussed earlier.

Jobeun then showed and explained the picture of the truck access.

Sargus asked Solberg if they have looked at the lighting plan.

Solberg said yes, they have looked at the photometric plan and the light shed from what they've proposed and it doesn't appear to have much of an impact outside of the property, especially on the residential properties to the east. He said that they are in approval of it. He said that the design review architect hasn't reviewed it himself, but from the city's side analysis, they approve of it.

Sargus asked when this will be annexed.

Solberg said the annexation plan has this out a little ways and that he would have to look it up to know for sure. He said that he believes it's in the 5-10 year, if not further out.

Sargus asked when they plan on opening to the public.

Jobeun said that it will be at least 24 months for the build out. He mentioned that they currently have special use permits and are operating out the Deer Creek Shopping Plaza.

Solberg than said that chapter 9 of the Comprehensive Plan includes the annexation plan, which shows 10-15 years for that area. He did mention that they are looking at the annexation plan as part of the Comprehensive Plan update process and here in the next few months there will probably be a revised annexation plan.

Malmquist closed the public hearing.

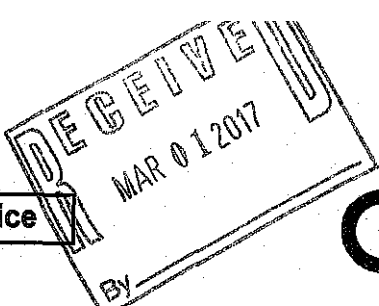

BACKGROUND

As you know, a majority of the major construction projects undertaken by the City potentially require the use of an engineering firm, design/architectural firm and ultimately a construction contractor. State Statute allows political subdivisions the use of a construction management at risk (CMR) contract as an alternative for some types of projects. This alternative among other things allows for collaboration of consulting and design services with the construction services and prequalification of potential contractors. Given the number and timing of projects the City has had and the number it plans to construct it is necessary to have this option available. The City adopted policies for CMR contracts, revisions of which are proposed as presented. Any Staff recommendation to use the CMR alternative for construction of a project by the City would seek permission from the City Council to do so.

The purpose of this Policy is to authorize the City, pursuant to the Political Subdivisions Construction Alternatives Act, Neb. Rev. Stat. §§13-2901 to 13-2914 (the "Act"), to enter into a construction management at risk contract for public projects.

The City shall not use a construction management at risk contract for a project, in whole or in part, for road, street, highway, water, wastewater, utility, or sewer construction.

DEFINITIONS:

For the purposes of this Policy, the following terms, as outlined in the Act, shall mean:

- 1) Construction management at risk contract: A contract by which a construction manager:
 - a. Assumes the legal responsibility to deliver a construction project within a contracted price to the City;
 - b. Acts as a construction consultant to the City during the design development phase of the project when the City's architect or engineer designs the project; and
 - c. Is the builder during the construction phase of the project.
- 2) Construction manager: The legal entity which proposes to enter into a construction management at risk contract.
- 3) Letter of interest: A statement indicating interest to enter into a construction management at risk contract for a project.
- 4) City: City of La Vista, Nebraska.
- 5) Proposal: An offer by a construction manager in response to a request for proposals to enter into a construction management at risk contract for a project pursuant to this Policy.
- 6) Request for letters of interest: The documentation or publication by which the City solicits letters of interest.
- 7) Reouest for proposals: The documentation by which the City solicits proposals.

PROCEDURES:

CONSTRUCTION MANAGEMENT AT RISK CONTRACTS

Authorization

The construction management at risk alternative system may not be used for a **construction** project to be constructed by the City unless the Mayor and City Council of the City of La Vista have adopted, by the affirmative votes of at least two-thirds of the members of the City Council, a resolution authorizing the use of that alternative system for the specific project.

Letters of interest/Prequalification Procedure

The City, if wishing to enter into a construction management at risk contract for a proposed project, shall prepare a request for letters of interest seeking indications of interest of prospective construction managers to enter into a construction management at risk contract for the project. Requests shall describe the project in sufficient detail to permit the construction manager to submit a letter of interest.

Requests for letters of interest shall be published in a newspaper of general circulation within the City at least thirty (30) days prior to the deadline for receipt of letters of interest. Requests for letters of interest should also be sent via first class mail to any construction manager upon request, and may also be made available on the City's website or as the City otherwise determines.

A submitted letter of interest shall serve to indicate to the City the prospective construction manager's interest in responding to a subsequent request for proposals concerning the proposed project and shall describe the prospective construction manager's (a) qualifications to serve as construction manager, (b) prior experience under construction management at risk delivery systems, and (c) experience in managing projects of size and scope similar to those of the proposed City project.

Letters of interest shall be reviewed by the City and the City shall select prospective construction managers based on information submitted to the City in response to the request for letters of interest, in accordance with this Policy and any procedures and standards adopted by the City. At least three (3) prospective construction managers shall be selected, except that if ~~only two~~fewer than three (3) construction managers have submitted letters of interest, the City shall select at least the number of two (2) prospective construction managers submitting letters of interest; provided, however, if fewer than two letters of interest are received, selection of the sole prospective construction manager shall be subject to approval of the City Administrator, City Engineer or her or his designee. Selected construction managers shall then be considered prequalified and eligible to receive a request for proposal.

Request for Proposals

The City shall prepare a request for proposals for a proposed project for which the City proposes to enter into a construction management at risk contract. The request for proposals shall be sent only to the pre-qualified construction managers selected based on information submitted to the City in response to the request for letters of interest. Construction managers shall submit proposals as required by the request for proposals.

Notice of the request for proposals shall be published in a newspaper of general circulation within the City at least thirty (30) days prior to the deadline for receipt and opening of proposals.

The request for proposals shall contain, at a minimum, the following request for proposal elements:

- 1) The legal identity of the City and that the City intends to build the project and ~~will execute a construction management at risk contract through its the Mayor and the La Vista City Council;~~
- 2) The policies adopted by the Mayor and La Vista City Council to be used when executing a construction management at risk contract;

- 3) The proposed terms and conditions of the construction management at risk contract, including any terms and conditions which are subject to further negotiation. The proposed general terms and conditions shall be consistent with nationally recognized model general terms and conditions which are standard in the design and construction industry in Nebraska. The proposed terms and conditions may set forth an initial determination of the manner by which the construction manager selects any subcontractor and may require that any work subcontracted be awarded by competitive bidding;
- 4) Any bonds and insurance required by law or as may be additionally required by the City;
- 5) General information about the project which will assist the City in its selection of the construction manager, including a project statement which contains information about the scope and nature of the project, the project site, the schedule and estimated budget;
- 6) The criteria for evaluation of proposals and the relative weight of each criterion; and
- 7) A description of any other information which the City chooses to

require.

Proposal. Evaluation

Proposals shall be sealed and shall not be opened until expiration of the time established for making proposals as set forth in the request for proposals. Proposals may be withdrawn at any time prior to acceptance. The City shall have the right to reject any and all proposals except for the purpose of evading the provisions and policies of the Act. The City may thereafter solicit new proposals using the same or different request for proposal elements.

The City shall refer the proposals for recommendation to a selection committee. The selection committee shall be a group of at least five (5) persons designated by the City. Members of the selection committee shall include, at a minimum:

- 1) One or more of the Mayor and/or Members of the La Vista City Council;
- 2) One or more members of the administration or staff of the City;
- 3) One or more of the City's architect or engineer;
- 4) One or more persons having special expertise relevant to selection of a construction manager under the Act; and
- 5) One or more residents of the City other than an individual listed above.

No member of the selection committee shall be employed by or have a financial interest in a construction manager who has a proposal being evaluated. No member of the selection committee designated under item "4" or item "5" above shall be employed by the City.

The selection committee and the City shall evaluate proposals taking into consideration the criteria listed below, with the maximum percentage of total points for evaluation that may be assigned to each criterion, in the request for proposals and in conducting the evaluation, as indicated below:

- 1) The financial resources of the construction manager to complete the project, ten percent (10%);
- 2) The ability of the proposed personnel of the construction manager to perform, thirty percent (30%);
- 3) The character, integrity, reputation, judgment, experience, and efficiency of the construction manager, thirty percent (30%);
- 4) The quality of performance by the construction manager on previous projects, thirty percent (30%);
- 5) The ability of the construction manager to perform within the time specified, thirty percent (30%);
- 6) The previous and existing compliance of the construction manager with laws relating to the contract, ten percent (10%); and
- 7) Other information as may be secured having a bearing on the selection, twenty percent (20%).

The records of the selection committee in evaluating proposals and making recommendations shall be considered public records.

The City shall evaluate and rank, in order of preference, each proposal of the prospective construction managers pursuant to and on the basis of best meeting the criteria in the request for proposals and taking into consideration the recommendation of the selection committee. At least three (3) prospective construction managers shall be selected for purposes of ranking, except that if ~~only two~~ fewer than three (3) construction managers have submitted proposals, the City shall select for ranking at least ~~two~~ the number of (2) prospective construction managers submitting proposals; provided, however, if fewer than two proposals are received, selection of the sole prospective construction manager shall be subject to approval of the City Administrator, City Engineer or her or his designee.

The City shall attempt to negotiate a construction management at risk contract with the highest ranked construction manager and may enter into a construction management at risk contract after negotiations; provided, however, if fewer than two proposals are received, attempted negotiation with the sole prospective construction manager shall be subject to approval of the City Administrator, City Engineer or her or his designee. The negotiations shall include a final determination of the manner by which the construction manager selects a subcontractor.

If the City is unable to negotiate a satisfactory contract with the highest ranked construction manager, the City may terminate negotiations with that construction manager. The City may then undertake negotiations with the second highest ranked construction manager and may enter into a construction management at risk contract after negotiations. If the City is unable to negotiate a satisfactory contract with the second highest ranked construction manager, the City may undertake negotiations with the third highest ranked construction manager, if any, and may enter into a construction management at risk contract after negotiations.

If the City is unable to negotiate a satisfactory contract with any of the ranked construction managers, the City may either revise the request for proposals and solicit new proposals or cancel the construction management at risk process.

A construction management at risk contract may be conditioned upon later refinements in scope and price and may permit the City in agreement with the construction manager to make changes

in the project without invalidating the contract. Later refinements shall not exceed the scope of the project statement contained in the request for proposals.

Nothing in the Political Subdivisions Construction Alternatives Act or in this Policy shall limit or reduce statutory or regulatory requirements regarding bonding or insurance.

Miscellaneous. The City Administrator is authorized to promulgate or specify additional procedures for the implementation of this Policy that are not inconsistent with the Act or with this Policy. If provisions of any such additional procedures or this Policy conflict with any provision of the Act, provisions of the Act shall control.

This Policy is solely for the use and guidance of the City and its representatives. It shall not be interpreted or applied so as to confer any right or entitlement on any construction manager, potential construction manager, contractor, consultant, vendor, or any other individual or entity.

Protest Procedures: Any individual or entity wishing to file a formal protest relating to the solicitation or execution of any construction management at risk contract by the City may file a written protest with the City Administrator within five (5) business days after the protester knew or should have known of the facts upon which the protest is based. The written protest must set forth a full recitation of the facts giving rise to the protest, state the grounds or *basis* for the protest, and include copies of all documents supporting the protest. Unless the protest is sooner resolved by mutual agreement between the protester and the City Administrator, the Mayor and City Council will consider and act upon such a timely filed protest by not later than the next regular City Council meeting held not less than five (5) calendar days after the written protest is received by the City Administrator. The decision of the Mayor and City Council will be final.

Implementation: Unless otherwise expressly required by this Policy, the Act, or other applicable law, the City Administrator, City Engineer, or any designee of the City Administrator or City Engineer from time to time, shall be authorized to implement and carry out any and all provisions of this Policy on behalf of the City, including without limitation, issuing or executing any notices or documents or making any determinations on behalf of the City.

SYNOPSIS

A public hearing has been scheduled to consider a rezoning for approximately 31.45 acres located northwest of 145th Street and Meadows Blvd.

FISCAL IMPACT

None.

RECOMMENDATION

Approval.

BACKGROUND

A public hearing has been scheduled to consider a rezoning application by J & H Investments, LLC, on behalf of the property owners, TC Accomodator 115, LLC; R & D Development; Doris M. Klingemann; and Maguire Properties, on approximately 31.45 acres currently described as Lot 4, Lakeview South II; Lot 1, Lakeview South II Replat 4; Lots 1 & 2, Lakeview South II Replat 6; Lot 2, Lakeview South II Replat 2; and S 1551.37 FT Tax Lot 4, 23-14-11. The property is generally located northwest of 145th Street and Meadows Blvd.

The purpose of the request is to allow for the zoning to more closely match the existing land uses. A detailed staff report is attached.

The Planning Commission held a public hearing on February 16, 2017, and unanimously recommended approval of the rezoning.

ORDINANCE NO. ____

AN ORDINANCE TO AMEND THE OFFICIAL ZONING MAP OF THE CITY OF LA VISTA, SARPY COUNTY, NEBRASKA; AND TO PROVIDE FOR THE EFFECTIVE DATE HEREOF.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE MAYOR AND CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF LA VISTA, SARPY COUNTY, NEBRASKA:

Section 1. Approval of Rezoning. On February 16, 2017, the La Vista Planning Commission conducted a public hearing on the matter of rezoning the tract of land set forth in Section 2 of this ordinance and reported to the City Council that it recommended approval of the zoning of said tract be changed from "I-1" Light Industrial, Gateway Corridor District (Overlay District) to "I-2" Heavy Industrial, Gateway Corridor District (Overlay District). On March 21, 2017, the City Council held a public hearing on said proposed change in zoning and found and determined that said proposed changes in zoning are advisable and in the best interests of the City. The City Council further found and determined that public hearings were duly held and notices, including published notice, written notice to adjacent property owners and notice posted at the properties, were duly given pursuant to Section 9.01 of the Zoning Ordinance. The City Council hereby approves said proposed changes in zoning as set forth in Section 2 of this ordinance.

Section 2. Amendment of the Official Zoning Map. Pursuant to Article 3 of the Zoning Ordinance, the following described tract of land is hereby rezoned from "I-1" Light Industrial, Gateway Corridor District (Overlay District) to "I-2" Heavy Industrial, Gateway Corridor District (Overlay District), and the Official Zoning Map of the City of La Vista is hereby amended to reflect the changes in zoning of the following described tracts of land from "I-1" Light Industrial, Gateway Corridor District (Overlay District) to "I-2" Heavy Industrial, Gateway Corridor District (Overlay District):

Lot 1, Lakeview South II; Lot 1, Lakeview South II Replat 4; Lot 1, Lakeview South II Replat 6; Lot 2, Lakeview South II Replat 6; Lot 2, Lakeview South II Replat 2; all in Section 23, Township 14 North, Range 11 East of the 6th P.M., Sarpy County, Nebraska.

The amended version of the official zoning map of the City of La Vista is hereby adopted and shall be signed by the Mayor, attested to by the City Clerk and shall bear the seal of the City under the following words:

"This is to certify that this is the official zoning map referred to in Article 3 Section 3.02 of Ordinance No. 848 of the City of La Vista, Nebraska"

and shall show the date of the adoption of that ordinance and this amendment.

Section 3. Effective Date. This ordinance shall be in full force and effect upon the date passage, approval and publication as provided by law.

AN ORDINANCE TO AMEND THE OFFICIAL ZONING MAP OF THE CITY OF LA VISTA, SARPY COUNTY, NEBRASKA; AND TO PROVIDE FOR THE EFFECTIVE DATE HEREOF.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE MAYOR AND CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF LA VISTA, SARPY COUNTY, NEBRASKA:

Section 1. Approval of Rezoning. "This is to certify that this is the official zoning map referred to in Article 3 Section 3.02 of Ordinance No. 848 of the City of La Vista, Nebraska"

and shall show the date of the adoption of that ordinance and this amendment.

Section 3. Effective Date. This ordinance shall be in full force and effect upon the date passage, approval and publication as provided by law.

1. Access to all lots included in the rezoning is provided through frontages along 145th Street or Meadows Blvd.

The rezoning itself will not require a traffic study. However, a traffic study has been required in relation to the platting request following this rezoning on the agenda.

D. UTILITIES:

1. The properties have access to water, gas, power and communication utilities. Development of the lot described as "South 1551.37 FT" of Tax Lot 4 will require a sanitary sewer connection to an existing sanitary sewer in 145th Street that drains to an existing lift station.

IV. REVIEW COMMENTS:

1. The proposed rezoning to I-2 Heavy Industrial matches up favorably with the IL Light Industrial (Sarpy County) zoning to the south of the subject property as the Sarpy County zoning regulations are more comparable to La Vista's Heavy Industrial district than the Light Industrial district.

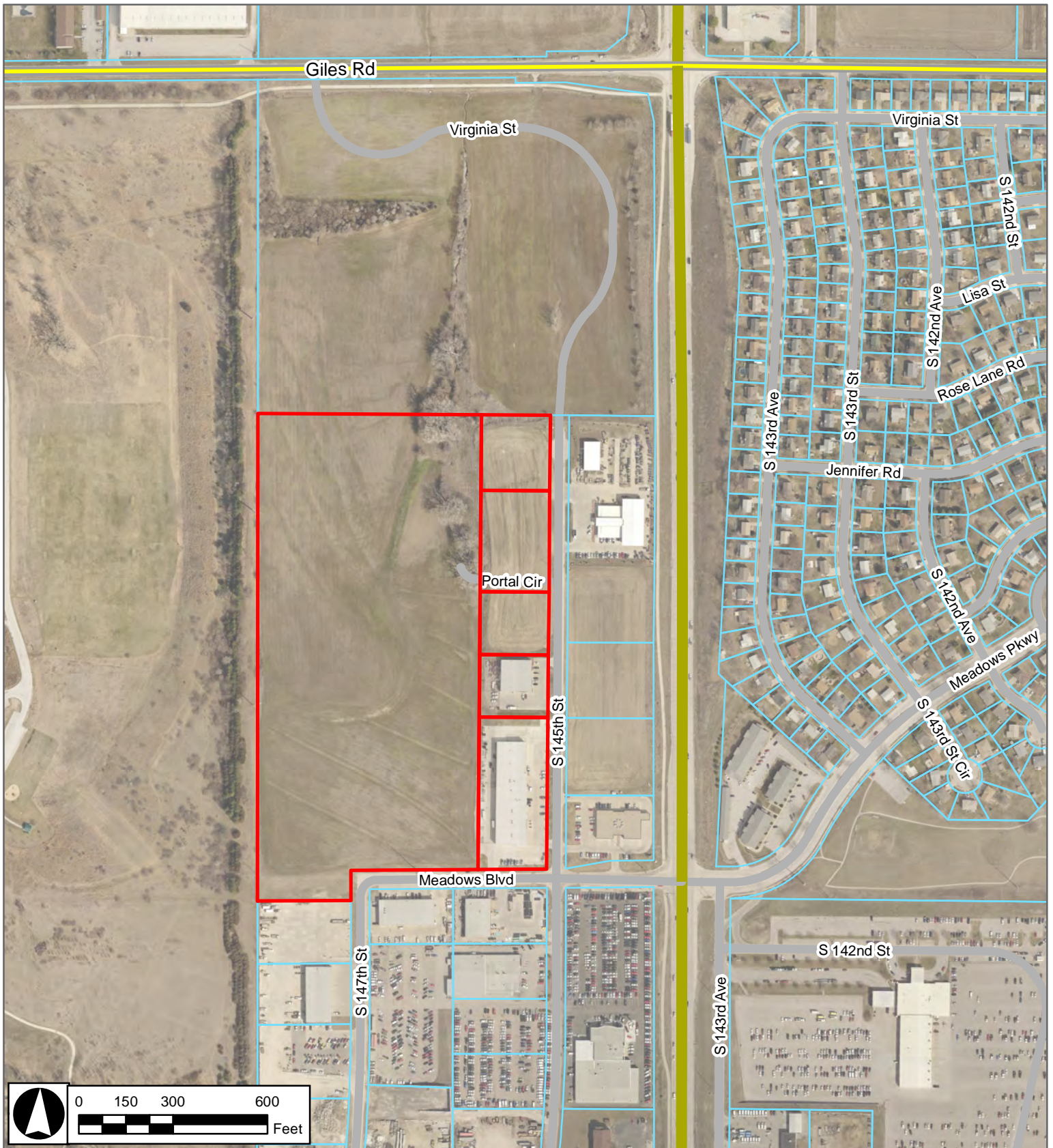

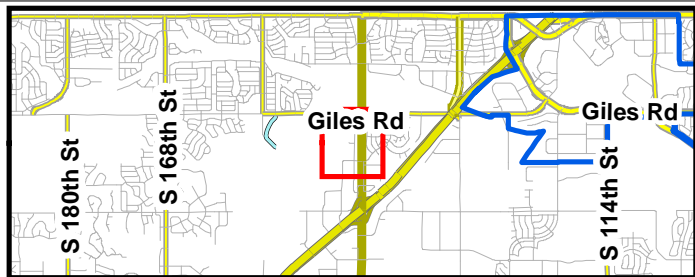

City staff have reviewed the application that was received for with a revised preliminary plat called Heimes and associated request for rezoning in a transmittal dated December 29, 2016. Based on the requirements for a preliminary plat in the City of La Vista Subdivision Regulations and considerations for rezoning, City staff have provided following comments:

General:

1. The preliminary plat and rezoning documents have been sent to the Papio-Missouri River Natural Resources District for review and comment as the subject property abuts the Wehrspann Lake Dam Site which is maintained by the PMNRD. Additional commentary may be provided based on the results of their review.

Preliminary Plat:

2. In regards to the proposed cul-de-sac, please label the street name as Portal Circle.
3. The water to serve this development needs to come from the Metropolitan Utilities District and a notation to that effect has been added to the plat.
4. In accordance with Article 3.03.15 of the Subdivision Regulations itemized cost estimates for public improvements need to be submitted including proposed sources of funding. The proposed cul-de-sac lies largely within property situated in SID 48. Is it proposed that SID 48 will build and maintain the road? The proposed sanitary sewer connects to an existing sanitary sewer in 145th Street that drains to an existing lift station. The preliminary needs to indicate if the intent is to remove the lift station which is implied by Note 8 on the revised preliminary plat. Tract sewer connection fees will be collected on this

property and remitted to Sarpy County. This will include \$5,500 at time of platting which will be remitted entirely to Sarpy County. Then, at building permit time, the tract connection fee of \$6,690 per acre will be collected from which \$5,500 will be sent to Sarpy County and the remainder will be retained by the City. The fee collected at time of building permit is subject to change on January 1st of each year.

5. Existing culverts under Giles Road may have capacity limitations in regards to storm water runoff that require detention in addition to the City's standard requirements. The City has requested information from Sarpy County on the culvert capacities under Giles Road and will pass that information along to the applicant to address this limitation. In addition, water quality from proposed public streets will need to be addressed in the drainage study.
6. The boundary of the drainage area and the design flow to Impact Pt. 5 will need to be clarified at the time the public improvement plans are prepared and submitted for review.
7. The existing grading permit will need to be modified to include the proposed cul-de-sac when installation of the improvements is undertaken.

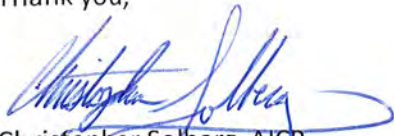
Rezoning:

8. In regards to Article 3.03.19 and relative to the rezoning request, the applicant needs to provide a statement as to the maximum expected peak hour traffic from proposed Lots 1, 2 3, and 4 using trip generation rates for industrial development consistent with the proposed I-2 Heavy Industrial zoning based on the Trip Generation manual published by the Institute of Transportation Engineers. The results of that peak hour estimation will determine whether any additional traffic impact study is required.
9. Lots abutting the west side of S. 145th Street should retain the Gateway Corridor Overlay that currently exists over these lots. The exhibits that note the change in the zoning should be amended to include the Gateway Corridor Overlay in addition to the proposed I-2 Heavy Industrial zoning.

In order for the Preliminary Plat and Rezoning to be considered for review at the February 16, 2017 Planning Commission meeting, revised plat documents will need to be provided for further review. Please submit 4 full size copies (along with electronic copies) of the revised documents by January 23, 2017 to ensure that the application stays on track for the review by Planning Commission.

SYNOPSIS

A resolution has been prepared to approve an Interlocal Cooperation Agreement with Sarpy County to jointly establish the Nebraska Multisport Agency.

FISCAL IMPACT

There are substantial public benefits to be realized by the City and its residents from the proposed development of a multisport complex, including new construction, permanent jobs, availability of new recreational facilities for residents and potential for additional hotel, dining, retail, entertainment and other development, and related tax revenues.

RECOMMENDATION

Approval.

BACKGROUND

On November 3, 2015, the City Council approved a Statement of Intent (SOI) describing proposed development of a state of the art championship athletic complex designed to host local, regional and national championship competitions in the areas of swimming, diving, soccer, and tennis, and provide facilities for public use, including recreational swimming. Formation of the Nebraska Multisport Agency by the City and County is recommended to construct and equip the recreational facilities. The Agency will issue revenue bonds to finance project costs and shall repay such bonds from revenues generated by or for the project and other available sources. Bonds issued by the Agency would not be a debt of either the City or County and will not constitute a general obligation of the Agency. The Agency will be responsible for repayment of Bonds and the use, operation and maintenance of the project. The City by separate action intends to construct public streets, parking, and other infrastructure up to \$10 million in accordance with a prudent phasing schedule and maintain such streets, parking, and infrastructure.

A RESOLUTION OF THE MAYOR AND CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF LA VISTA, NEBRASKA APPROVING AN INTERLOCAL COOPERATION AGREEMENT WITH SARPY COUNTY TO ESTABLISH THE NEBRASKA MULTISPORT AGENCY.

WHEREAS, Article XV, Section 18 of the Constitution of the State of Nebraska and the Interlocal Cooperation Act (Chapter 13, Article 8, Reissue Revised Statutes of Nebraska, as amended, the "**Interlocal Act**") authorize any two or more public agencies to exercise jointly any power or powers, privileges or authority exercised or capable of exercise by any of the participating public agencies, and to enter into agreements with one another for such purposes.

WHEREAS, Each of the City and the County (each a "**Party**" and, collectively, the "**Parties**") is a "public agency" as defined in the Interlocal Act and is authorized to acquire, operate and maintain real and personal property for the purpose of providing recreational facilities.

WHEREAS, Each Party deems it necessary, desirable, advisable and in its best interest to construct, equip, furnish, operate and maintain joint recreational facilities to be known as the "Nebraska Multisport Complex" (the "**Project**") and to enter into an Interlocal Cooperation Agreement for such purposes in the form presented with this resolution (the "**Agreement**").

WHEREAS, Each Party desires to enter into the Agreement to jointly establish, plan, construct, equip, furnish, operate and maintain the Project as provided in the Interlocal Act and the Agreement.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the City shall enter into an Interlocal Cooperation Agreement creating the Nebraska Multisport Agency with the County, and the Mayor and City Clerk be and they are hereby authorized to execute on behalf of the City said Agreement in substantially the form presented but with any changes as such officers shall deem appropriate for and on behalf of the City; and that the Mayor or his designee and City Administrator or her designee are hereby appointed to serve as the initial representatives of the City (each referred to as a "Board Member") to serve on the Board of Directors of the Agency formed pursuant to the Agreement. Each such Board Member shall be authorized to designate one or more alternates to act on his or her behalf as Board Member, unless and until the Council names one or more alternates to serve in such capacities.

This resolution shall be in full force and take effect from and after adoption as provided by law.

INTERLOCAL COOPERATION AGREEMENT

ESTABLISHING THE

NEBRASKA MULTISPORT AGENCY

This **INTERLOCAL COOPERATION AGREEMENT**, dated _____, 2017 (the “**Agreement**”), is between the **CITY OF LA VISTA, NEBRASKA**, (the “**City**”) and **THE COUNTY OF SARPY, IN THE STATE OF NEBRASKA** (the “**County**”).

RECITALS

1. Article XV, Section 18 of the Constitution of the State of Nebraska and the Interlocal Cooperation Act (Chapter 13, Article 8, Reissue Revised Statutes of Nebraska, as amended, the “**Interlocal Act**”) authorize any two or more public agencies to exercise jointly any power or powers, privileges or authority exercised or capable of exercise by any of the participating public agencies, and to enter into agreements with one another for such purposes.

2. Each of the City and the County (each a “**Party**” and, collectively, the “**Parties**”) is a “public agency” as defined in the Interlocal Act and is authorized to acquire, operate and maintain real and personal property for the purpose of providing recreational facilities.

3. Each Party deems it necessary, desirable, advisable and in its best interest to construct, equip, furnish, operate and maintain joint recreational facilities to be known as the “Nebraska Multisport Complex” and to enter into this Agreement for such purposes.

4. Each Party desires to enter into this Agreement to jointly establish, plan, construct, equip, furnish, operate and maintain the Project as provided in the Interlocal Act and this Agreement.

Now, for and in consideration of the terms and provisions of this Agreement and the mutual obligations and undertaking of the Parties contained in this Agreement, the Parties hereby agree as follows:

ARTICLE I DEFINITIONS

The following terms when used in this Agreement have the following meanings:

“**Agency**” means the “Nebraska Multisport Agency”, a separate legal entity and a public body corporate and politic of the State organized and existing pursuant to the provisions of the Interlocal Act and this Agreement.

“**Agreement**” means this Interlocal Cooperation Agreement dated as of the date first written above as it may be amended and supplemented from time to time.

“**Board**” means the Board of Directors of the Agency established pursuant to **Article IV** hereof.

“**Bonds**” means bonds, notes or other evidences of indebtedness issued by the Agency pursuant to the provisions of the Interlocal Act to finance or refinance all or any part of the costs of the Project.

“City” means the City of La Vista, Nebraska, a body corporate and political subdivision of the State.

“Construction Costs” means all reasonable or necessary costs and expenses to be paid with respect to the construction of the Project, including the total of all reasonable or necessary expenses incidental to the acquisition and construction of the Project, including without limitation the following:

(a) the expenses of studies and surveys, land title and mortgage title policies, architectural and engineering services and the cost of legal, organization or marketing services;

(b) financial and underwriting fees and expenses;

(c) the cost of acquiring or demolishing existing structures, if any, developing the site of and constructing and equipping a new building constituting a part of the Project;

(d) rehabilitating, reconstructing, repairing or remodeling existing buildings constituting a part of the Project; and

(e) all other necessary and incidental expenses, including interest during construction on Bonds issued to finance the Project to a date subsequent to the estimated date of completion thereof, and any other costs permitted under this Agreement.

“County” means The County of Sarpy, in the State of Nebraska, a body corporate and political subdivision of the State.

“Director” means an individual appointed by the governing body of the County or City to serve on the Board.

“Effective Date” means the date on which this Agreement shall be fully effective, which shall be the date this Agreement has been executed by the City and County.

“Expenses” means all reasonable and necessary expenses of operation, maintenance and repair of the Project and keeping the Project in good repair and working order, determined in accordance with generally accepted accounting principles, including without limiting the generality of the foregoing, current maintenance charges, expenses of reasonable upkeep and repairs, salaries, wages, costs of materials and supplies, annual audits, properly allocated share of charges for insurance, the cost of purchased water, gas and power, if any, and all other expenses incident to the operation of the Project, but shall exclude all general administrative expenses of the Parties not related to the operation of the Project.

“Fiscal Year” means July 1 through June 30.

“Improvement Costs” means all reasonable and necessary cost and expenses to be paid with respect to the Project for the alteration, improvement and/or extension of the Project, including the physical buildings or infrastructure of the building.

“Interlocal Act” means the Interlocal Cooperation Act (Chapter 13, Article 8, Reissue Revised Statutes of Nebraska, as amended).

“Party” or **“Parties”** has the meaning provided in the Recitals hereof.

“Project” means a multisport complex which may include (a) a natatorium (aquatic Center) including competition pools, teaching and fitness pools, (b) an outdoor recreational pool and spectator seats, a tennis center with indoor and outdoor courts and spectator seats, (c) a soccer complex and playing fields, and (d) a support center and other related and ancillary facilities.

“State” means the State of Nebraska.

ARTICLE II ESTABLISHMENT OF THE AGENCY

Pursuant to the authority contained in the Interlocal Act, the Parties hereby create and organize Nebraska Multisport Agency as a separate legal entity and a joint entity as a public body corporate and politic of the State to accomplish the Project and to provide for the joint use, operation and maintenance of the Project, all pursuant to the terms, provisions and limitations contained in this Agreement.

ARTICLE III PURPOSE

The purposes of the Agency are to exercise any power, privilege or authority determined to be necessary by the Board to construct, equip, furnish, use, operate, maintain, repair, replace, and finance the Project, or any parts thereof, in such manner as shall be necessary, desirable, advisable or in the best interests of the Parties in the manner and as provided for by the Interlocal Act and this Agreement. The Agency shall issue Bonds to pay a portion of the Project Costs and shall pay such Bonds from revenues generated by the Project, and funds provided to the Agency for purposes of such Project and pledged for the Bonds and from contracts entered into with respect to such Project, and from other available sources of the Agency. The Agency shall be responsible for the use, operation and maintenance of the Project.

ARTICLE IV ORGANIZATION

Section 401. Appointment of Directors. Concurrently with the authorization and approval of this Agreement, the City Council of the City shall appoint two Directors, and the Board of Commissioners of the County shall appoint two Directors. Each governing body shall be authorized to provide for one or more alternates who are authorized to act on behalf of a Director. Each Director shall serve at the pleasure of the governing body appointing such Director and may be removed at any time, with or without cause, by such governing body. Each Director may be, but need not be, a member of the governing body of the Party making such appointment. In the event of the death, disability or disqualification of an individual serving as a Director, the governing body appointing such Director shall promptly appoint a successor. A vacancy shall be filled for the balance of such unexpired term in the same manner as the original appointment until such term expires or the Director is removed by the Party making such appointment. No Director shall receive compensation for his or her services, but shall be entitled to actual and necessary expenses incurred in the discharge of his or her official duties.

Section 402. Term of Office. Each Director shall serve a three-year term beginning immediately upon appointment and ending on the earlier of (1) the end of the calendar year containing the three year anniversary of the Director’s appointment, (2) the expiration of the Director’s term on the governing body appointing such Director or (3) appointment of a successor. Each Director shall be

eligible for reappointment to one or more additional terms upon the expiration of his or her initial or any subsequent term.

Section 403. Voting. Unless the Board unanimously adopts different rules, each Director shall have one vote on matters before the Board. Except as may otherwise be provided herein, or in any agreement to which the Agency is a party, all actions of the Agency may be taken with the concurrence of a majority of the Directors entitled to vote.

Section 404. Rules of Governance. The Board shall adopt rules of governance that will include at a minimum, the following:

(a) ***Quorum.*** A majority of the Directors shall constitute a quorum for the transaction of any business.

(b) ***Officers.*** The Board shall elect a president, a vice president, a secretary and a treasurer from among the Directors. One Director may serve as secretary and treasurer.

Section 405. Meetings and Notice. The Board shall meet within 30 days of the Effective Date for the purpose of electing officers and addressing other organizational matters as it deems necessary or appropriate. Thereafter, the Board shall meet at least annually at such time and place as it shall designate. Special meetings of the Board may be called by the chair or any two Directors. Written notice of each meeting and the related agenda shall be provided to each Director at least two days prior to each such meeting.

The Board shall give public notice of each meeting by such method designated by the Board from time to time, and each meeting shall be conducted in accordance with the Nebraska Open Meetings Act (Chapter 84, Article 14, Reissue Revised Statutes of Nebraska, as amended).

ARTICLE V DURATION

This Agreement shall be in effect from its Effective Date for a term of 99 years, or such earlier date as may be mutually agreed by the Parties. Notwithstanding the foregoing, in no event shall this Agreement terminate so long as any Bonds issued by the Agency remain outstanding and unpaid.

ARTICLE VI POWERS

The Agency shall have all powers of a joint entity under the Interlocal Act, including, without limitation, the power to engage in any and all lawful acts and activities concerning the construction, equipping, furnishing, use, operation, maintenance, repair, replacement, or financing of the Project, or any parts thereof, and related functions, as and to the same extent that such power is possessed and capable of exercise by either Party under applicable law. The powers so conferred upon and delegated to the Agency shall include, without limitation of the generality of the foregoing, the power to:

(a) enter into contracts with public or private corporations, public agencies and other entities or persons for the construction, equipping, furnishing, operation, maintenance, repair, replacement, or financing of the Project, or any parts thereof, and all other contracts, agreements and transactions necessary or desirable in connection with the Project;

(b) acquire by gift, grant, purchase, or otherwise and to lease any property (real or personal), building, works or improvements necessary or convenient for the purposes provided for in this Agreement;

(c) issue Bonds, borrow money or incur indebtedness pursuant to the Interlocal Act, including Bonds as to which the principal and interest are payable exclusively from all or a portion of the revenue from the Project or other property of the Agency, from one or more revenue-producing contracts, including securities acquired from any person, or leases made by the joint entity with any person or the Parties, or from its revenue generally or which may be additionally secured by a pledge of any grant, subsidy, or contribution from any person or a pledge of any income or revenue, funds, or money of the Agency from any source whatsoever or a mortgage or security interest in any real or personal property, commodity, product, or service or interest therein;

(d) to borrow money or accept contributions, grants or other financial assistance from the State, public agencies, public or private corporations and other entities or persons, and to comply with such conditions and enter into such contracts, covenants, mortgages, trust indentures, leases or agreements as may be necessary, convenient or desirable;

(e) to contract with and compensate consultants for professional services including, but not limited to, architects, engineers, planners, lawyers, accountants, financial advisors and others found necessary or useful and convenient to the stated purposes of the Agency;

(f) sue and be sued in its own name; and

(g) take such other actions, engage in such other transactions, enter into such contracts and agreements and do all other things as may be necessary, convenient or appropriate to accomplish its purposes or carry out any of its powers.

All of the power of the Agency shall be exercised by or under the control, supervision and direction of the Board. The enumeration of powers herein shall not be construed as limitation on the powers of the Agency, and the Agency shall have the ability to exercise all other powers necessary or desirable to the accomplishment of its purposes. The delegation of powers to the Agency herein is non-exclusive and the exercise of any or all of these powers by the Agency shall not preclude any Party of contemporaneously exercising the same or similar powers.

ARTICLE VII ALLOCATION OF COSTS; PERSONAL PROPERTY

Section 701. Allocation of Construction Costs. The Construction Costs for the Project shall be paid from (a) the proceeds of the Bonds issued by the Agency, (b) the proceeds of grants or appropriations received for the express purposes of funding the Project, and (c) other available funds of the Agency.

Section 702. Allocation of Expenses. The Agency shall maintain complete and accurate books and records of all its costs and expenses that are properly classified as Expenses. All amounts received by the Agency for the use of the Project shall be credited and applied to the payment of Expenses, subject to any agreements entered into in connection with the issuance of Bonds. Neither Party shall be responsible for payment of Expenses from funds of such Party.

Section 703. Real and Personal Property. Title to the all real and personal property, including the Project, shall be held by the Agency during the term of this Agreement. Upon the expiration of the term of this Agreement or upon its termination, or upon other dissolution of this Agreement, title to all such property shall be distributed to the City. All conveyances of real property owned or held in the name of the Agency shall be authorized by resolution of the Board and executed by an officer of the Agency on behalf of the Agency.

ARTICLE VIII ANNUAL BUDGET; ISSUANCE OF BONDS

Section 801. Annual Operations Budget. The Board shall prepare a budget based on the Agency's Fiscal Year for the operation of the Agency, the same to be adopted by the Board no later than the end of the immediately preceding Fiscal Year. No budget shall be required for the Agency's initial fiscal year. The annual budget of Expenses and the annual budget of Construction Costs shall be consolidated into a comprehensive budget that reflects all of the Agency's operations and the Project. The financial records of the Agency shall be audited at the end of each fiscal year by an independent certified public accountant appointed by the Board. The Agency shall make and file such financial reports and budget documents as may be required by law.

In the event the Board fails to approve a final budget by the beginning of any Fiscal Year, the Agency shall operate in accordance with the budget for the immediately preceding Fiscal Year until a budget is approved by the Board.

Section 802. Issuance of Bonds. The Agency may by resolution of the Board issue Bonds in one or more series from time to time to finance Project Costs. All such Bonds shall be special obligations of the Agency. Any bonds or debt issued will not constitute an indebtedness of County or City and will not constitute a general obligation of Agency. The Agency will comply with all applicable requirements for the issuance of bonds.

Section 803. Improvements Approval, Budget and Costs. The Board may consider the construction or installation of improvements to the Project, including any alteration, improvement and/or extension of the Project.

ARTICLE IX OPERATIONS

Section 901. Project Administration, Management and Operation. The Board shall provide for the administration, management and operation of the Agency and the Project. The Board from time to time may arrange for any Party to provide any administrative, management, professional, or other services or to perform or carry out any administrative, management or operational acts or functions on behalf of the Agency, or may contract with any other political subdivision or other entity or person for any such services, acts, or functions; and the Agency may pay or reimburse all costs and expenses for such services, acts, or functions.

Section 902 Administrative Agent. Notwithstanding anything in this Agreement to the contrary and in addition to any other persons or entities from time to time designated in any resolution, action, document or instrument of the Agency or Board, and unless otherwise determined by the Board or

City, the City shall serve as the lead agent on behalf of the Agency in carrying out all administrative, management and operating functions of the Agency (the “Administrative Agent”). In such capacity as the Administrative Agent, the City may use any and all City staff, resources, representatives and advisors as deemed appropriate, and shall follow City policies and procedures, unless otherwise specifically directed or approved by the Board. Any and all actions taken by the City and its representatives, staff or advisors pursuant to this Section 902 shall be deemed to have been properly taken on behalf of the Agency, unless otherwise specifically directed or ordered by the Board. The Agency may pay or reimburse all costs and expenses of any Party in connection with this Section 902.

ARTICLE X NOT FOR PROFIT

It is expressly understood that the Agency is a public body and is to be operated not for profit, and no profit, dividend or asset of the Agency shall inure to the benefit of any individual.

ARTICLE XI DISSOLUTION

The Agency shall not be dissolved so long as any Bonds are outstanding under the instrument pursuant to which they were issued. Upon dissolution of the Agency, all interest in real and personal property, including the Project and any related capital improvements used in the operation of the Project, shall be distributed to the City.

ARTICLE XII AMENDMENT

This Agreement may be amended in writing, signed by the Parties; provided, however, any amendment hereto must first be approved by resolution of the governing body of each Party.

ARTICLE XIII APPLICABLE LAW

This Agreement is made under and shall be subject to and construed in accordance with the laws of the State, particularly the Interlocal Act.
