**Preschool Story Time and Sing-a-long** met the first Thursday in April and had 24 kids and 16 adults attend.




April 28 for **Preschool Play Time Craft Day**, we had 40 preschoolers and 32 parents create May Baskets.

### **Current Programs**

**Adult Softball** teams are in week 6 of a 14-week season. Due to rainouts, the season will be extended slightly.

**La Vista 4/5 Youth Soccer Academy and 6/7 Youth Soccer League** concluded their season on Saturday, May 7.

**Spring Flag Football League** is in week 6 of an 8-week season. They are scheduled to finish up on June 11<sup>th</sup>.

**Youth Baseball** started their regular season games the week of May 1. They will play games through June with tournament play starting on June 20 for our Yearling teams and June 27 for our Mustang and Bronco teams.

## **LA VISTA FALLS GOLF COURSE**

Golf Rounds April 2016	= 1,370 (-14 rounds from April 2015)
FootGolf Rounds April 2016	= 48 (+48 rounds from April 2015)
Total Rounds April 2016	= 1,418 (+34 rounds from April 2015)
Golf Rounds fiscal year 15/16 thru April	= 4,482 (-469 golf rounds from fiscal 14/15)
FootGolf Rounds fiscal year 15/16 thru April	= 166 (+166 FootGolf rounds from fiscal 14/15)
Total Rounds fiscal year 15/16 thru April	= 4,648 (-303 total rounds from fiscal 14/15)

Round counts could have been much better if the weather would have cooperated a little more. April was a windy, rainy and wet month. From April 18 through April 30 we had 6 days of heavy rain which caused 5 days where it was too wet to allow golf carts to be used, which then resulted in low round counts.

As of May 7<sup>th</sup>, the Wednesday night women's golf league and the Friday morning men's league have been rained out twice and have yet to play. The Tuesday night Men's league has been lucky and have been able to play both their scheduled nights.
